


Thinking of Ancient History at University?



Ancient History is a well-respected and commonly-offered degree course. Along with allowing students to deepen their understanding of the ancient world, it also provides them with a range of transferable skills which employers value highly.

A typical Ancient History degree will give students the opportunity to choose their units of study from a range of topics, often covering ancient Greece and Rome, but also other ancient societies. Many courses allow you to study an ancient language, but this is not normally

compulsory. Other common features include the study of ancient literature and thought, along with modules designed to equip you with the skills to analyse ancient sources. Finally, most degree programmes also include a final dissertation allowing you to focus on a particular topic and gain real expertise in it.

Ancient History is offered by a wide number of universities and entry requirements are varied. See below for some examples.

Most universities also offer **Classical Civilisation** which combines the historical study of the ancient past with a focus on its literature, such as the epic poems of Homer, Greek tragedy, and Roman satire.

Finally, Ancient History is an excellent subject to combine with another in a joint honours degree. Combinations often include Ancient History with English, History, Philosophy or Archaeology.
