Question 1

$$f(x) = \ln(1 + \sin x), \quad \sin x \neq -1.$$

a) Find the Maclaurin expansion of $f(x)$ up and including the term in x^3 . (5)

b) Hence show that

$$\int_0^{\frac{1}{4}} \ln(1 + \sin x) \, dx \approx 0.028809. \quad (3)$$

Question 2

Use the method of differences to show that

$$\frac{1}{1 \times 2 \times 3} + \frac{4}{2 \times 3 \times 4} + \frac{7}{3 \times 4 \times 5} + \dots + \frac{3n-2}{n(n+1)(n+2)} = \frac{n^2}{(n+1)(n+2)} \quad (7)$$

Question 3

The points A and B have respective coordinates $(-1,0)$ and $(1,0)$.

The locus of the point $P(x, y)$ traces a curve in such a way so that $|AP||BP| = 1$.

a) By forming a Cartesian equation of the locus of P , show that the polar equation of the curve is

$$r^2 = 2 \cos 2\theta, \quad 0 \leq \theta < 2\pi. \quad (6)$$

b) Sketch the curve. (3)

Question 4

The function f is defined by.

$$f(x) \equiv \frac{ax+b}{e^x}, \quad x \in \mathbb{R},$$

where a and b are non zero constants.

The mean value of f in the interval $(\ln 2, \ln 4)$ is $\frac{1}{4 \ln 2}$.

Given further that

$$\int_1^{\infty} f(x) \, dx = 3,$$

determine the value of a and the value of b . (10)

Question 5

The curve with the following equation is defined in the largest real domain.

$$y = (4x-3)\sqrt{-8(2x^2-3x+1)} + \arcsin(4x-3).$$

a) Show that

$$\frac{dy}{dx} = k\sqrt{-2x^2+3x-1},$$

where k is an exact constant to be found. (7)

b) Hence find the exact value of the following integral.

$$\int_{\frac{1}{2}}^1 \sqrt{-2x^2+3x-1} \, dx. \quad (4)$$

Question 6

$$f(x) \equiv \operatorname{artanh} x, \quad x \in \mathbb{R}, \quad |x| < 1$$

- a) Use the definition of the hyperbolic tangent to prove that

$$f(x) \equiv \frac{1}{2} \ln \left[\frac{1+x}{1-x} \right]. \quad (5)$$

- b) Use a method involving complex numbers and the trigonometric identity

$$1 + \tan^2 x \equiv \sec^2 x,$$

to obtain the hyperbolic equivalent

$$1 - \tanh^2 x \equiv \operatorname{sech}^2 x. \quad (3)$$

- c) Hence solve the equation

$$6 \operatorname{sech}^2 x - \tanh x = 4,$$

giving the two solutions in the form $\pm \frac{1}{2} \ln k$, where k are two distinct integers. (6)

Question 7

The complex number is defined as

$$z = (1 + i \tan \theta)^3, \quad -\frac{\pi}{2} < \theta < \frac{\pi}{2}.$$

By considering the real part of z , or otherwise, prove the validity of the following trigonometric identity

$$1 - 3 \tan^2 \theta \equiv \frac{\cos 3\theta}{\cos^3 \theta}. \quad (6)$$

Question 8

$$\frac{dx}{dt} + y = e^{-t} \quad \text{and} \quad \frac{dy}{dt} - x = e^t.$$

Given that $x = 0$, $y = 0$ at $t = 0$, solve the differential equations to obtain simplified expressions for $x = f(t)$ and $y = g(t)$.
