## **Unseen Comparison Practice**

Compare the presentation of violence in 'Chainsaw Versus the Pampas Grass' by Simon Armitage and 'The Mower' by Philip Larkin.

- 1<sup>st</sup> paragraph: Briefly introduce by giving a quick summary of how each poem presents violence.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph: Discuss in more detail how some of the theme of violence in each poem can be discussed in more detail, this time incorporating examples from the text to illustrate points.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph: Present and evaluate briefly examples of language and imagery which can be linked to the argument on violence, again incorporating examples from the text to illustrate points.
- 4<sup>th</sup> paragraph: Present and evaluate briefly examples of form and structure which can be linked to the argument on violence, again incorporating examples from the text to illustrate points.
- 5<sup>th</sup> paragraph: Try and write an evaluative conclusion which poem seems more optimistic, maybe?
