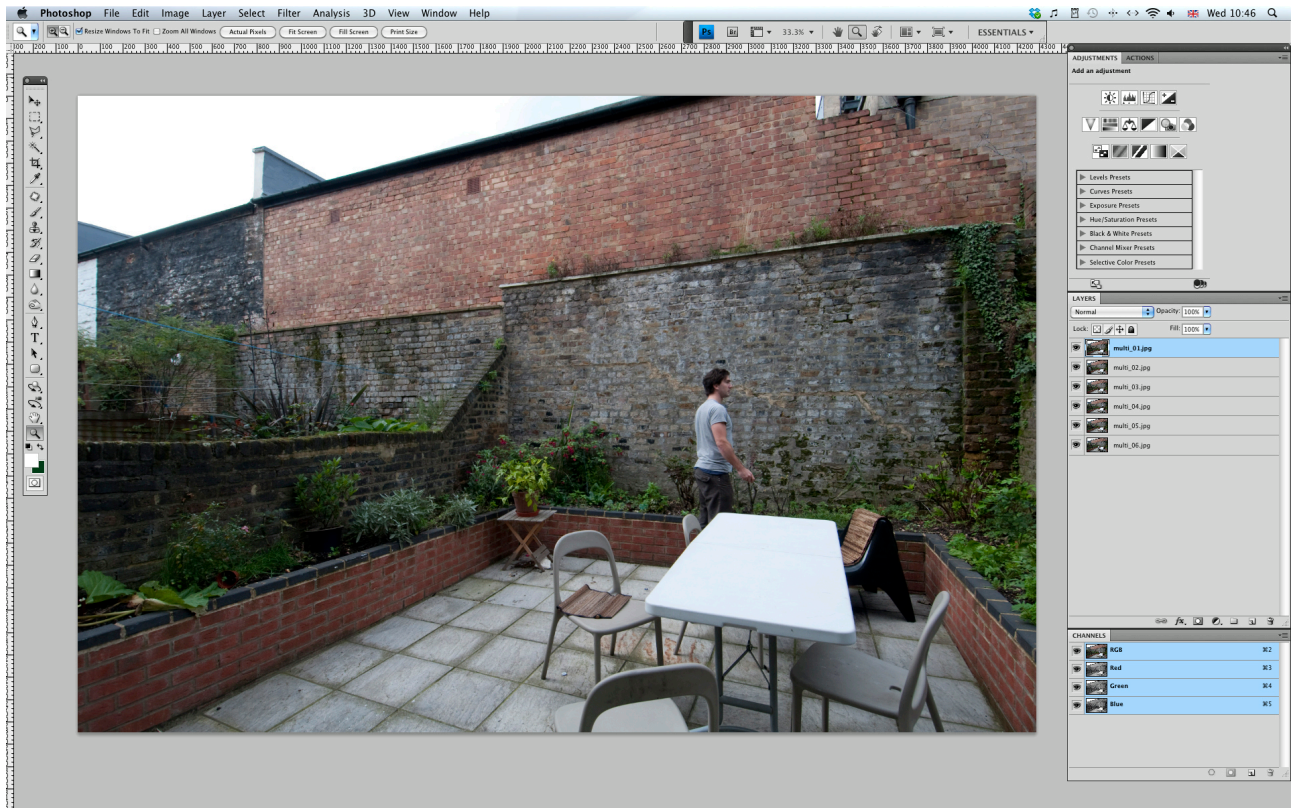


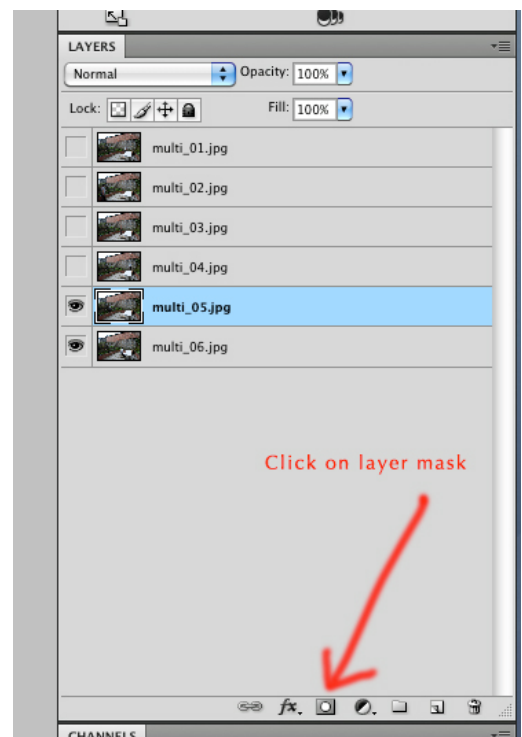
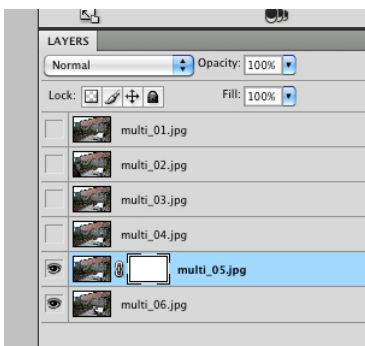
# Multi Me Instructions

1. Open up photoshop go File - Scripts - Load Files into Stack
2. Browse to find all of the photos you wish to use - select photos - click ok  
Your photos will open up as individual layers within the same image.

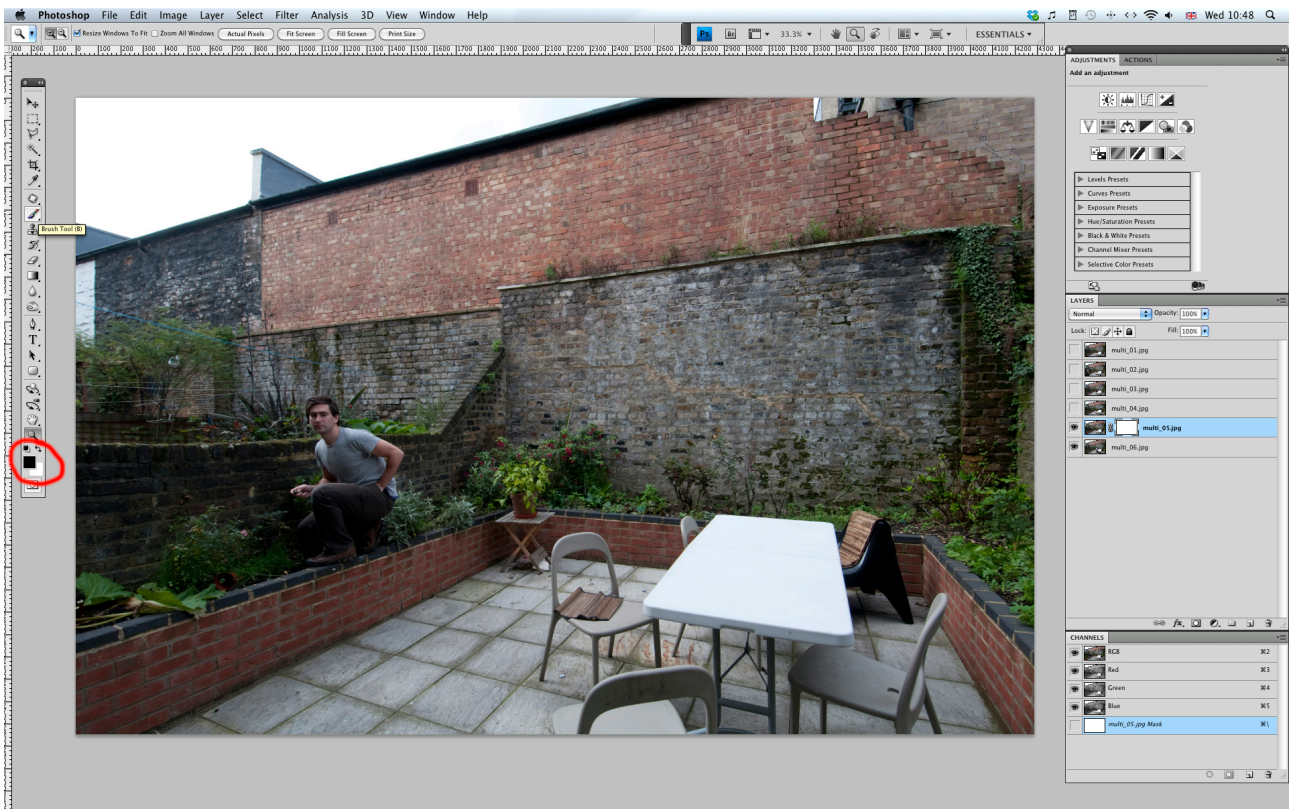


3. Turn off all but the two bottom layers. To do this left click on the eyes next to the layers. Activate the second layer from the bottom - left click on the layer and it will become highlighted in blue.

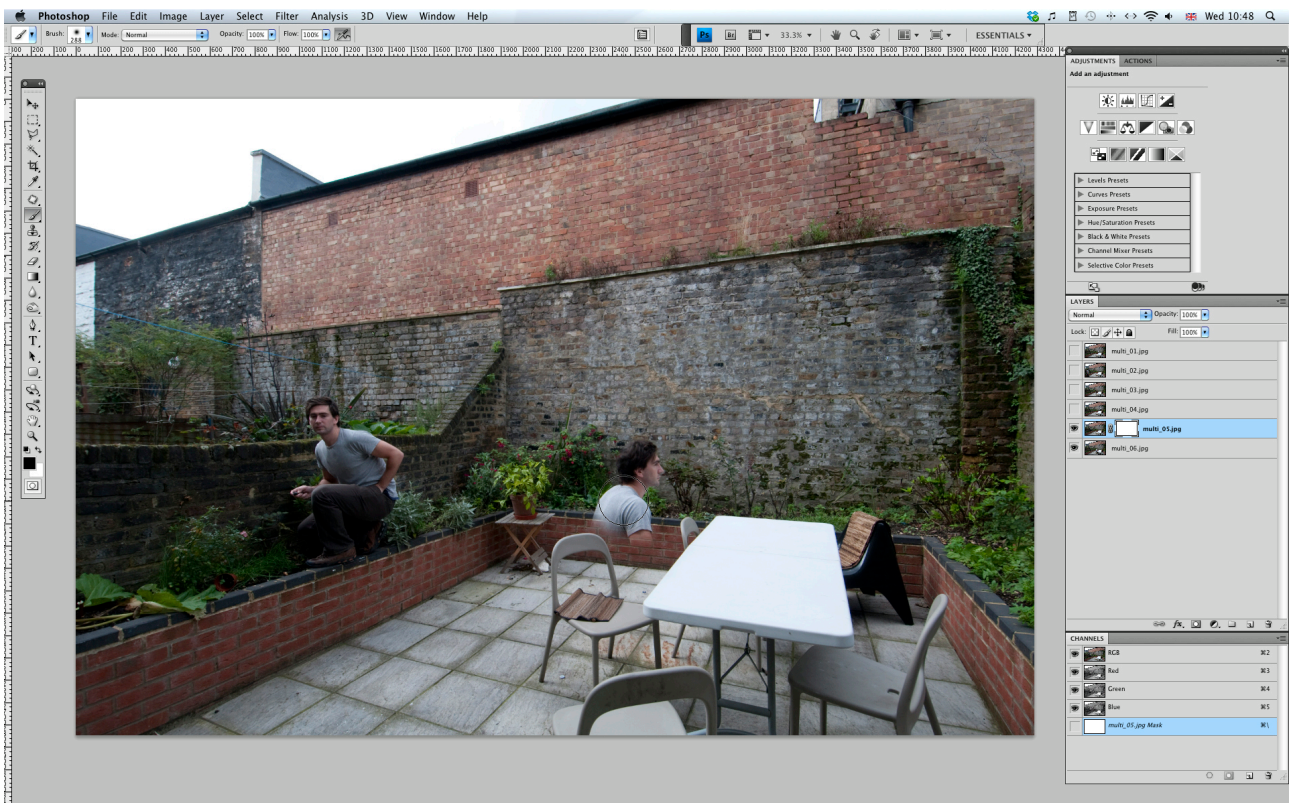
4. Now left click on the layer mask icon. A white rectangle should appear next to the layer icon



5. At the bottom of your tool bar you have your foreground and background colours. If your foreground is not black and your background is not white press D to reset these.

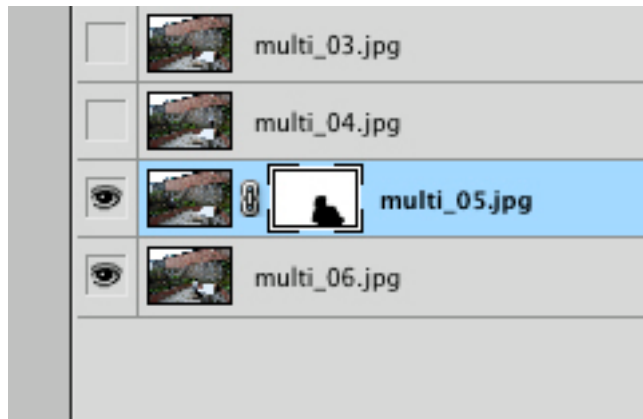


6. Press B to select your paint brush and begin painting over the area where in the layer below there is a figure. In effect this gives the appearance of erasing the top layer allowing the bottom layer to come through.





7. Notice how the layer mask reveals the area you have painted black. If you switch your foreground and background colours about (press x) and start painting over the same area again you will bring back the layer. You can switch between the white and black brush to take away and bring back accordingly.

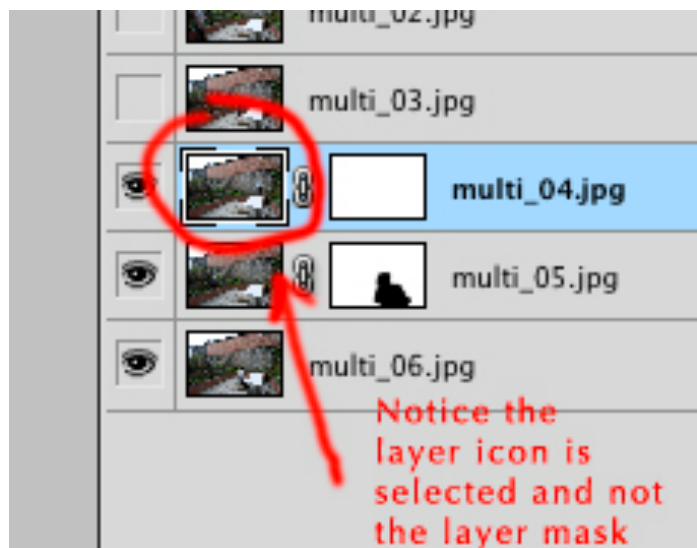


8. When you have your second figure in the scene turn the third layer from the bottom on (click on the eye). Select this layer by left clicking on it. Now left click on the layer mask and begin the process again - painting in black to allow the layers beneath to come through.

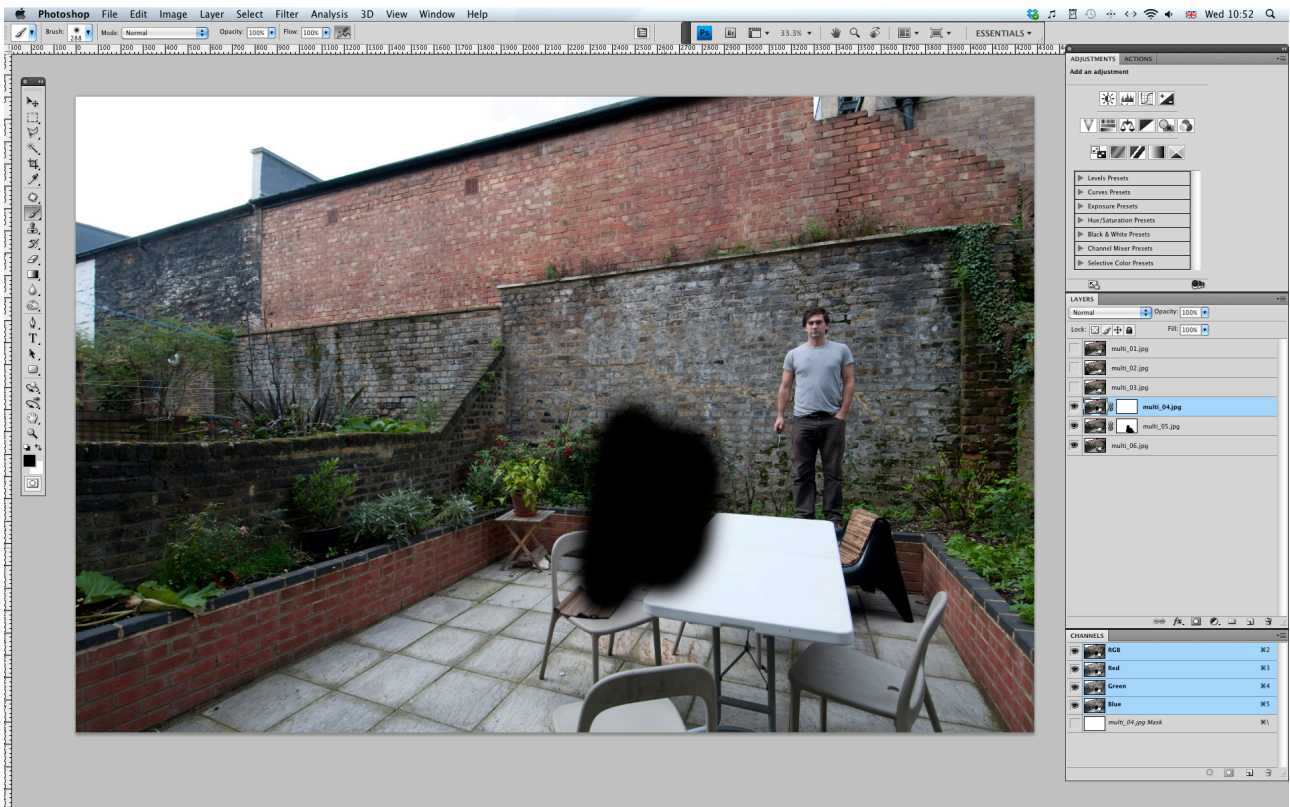
### **Important!**

**Make sure you have the layer mask selected or else you will paint in black or white onto the image.**

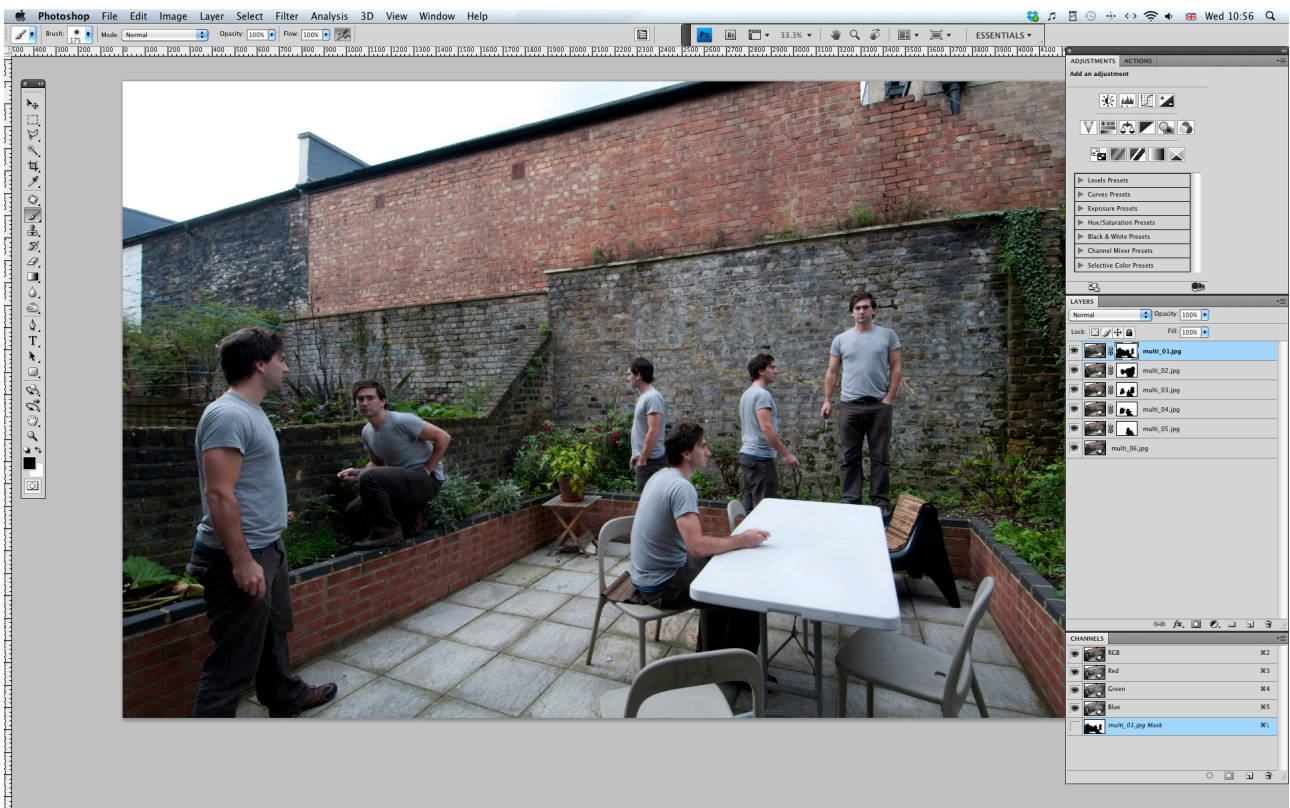
**Notice how there is a white box around the layer mask highlighting that you are working on this and not the image itself.**



With the layer highlighted you may achieve results like this:



### 9. Carry on building up your layers





10. When complete, flatten image. To do this left click on the button highlighted in the image and select flatten image.
