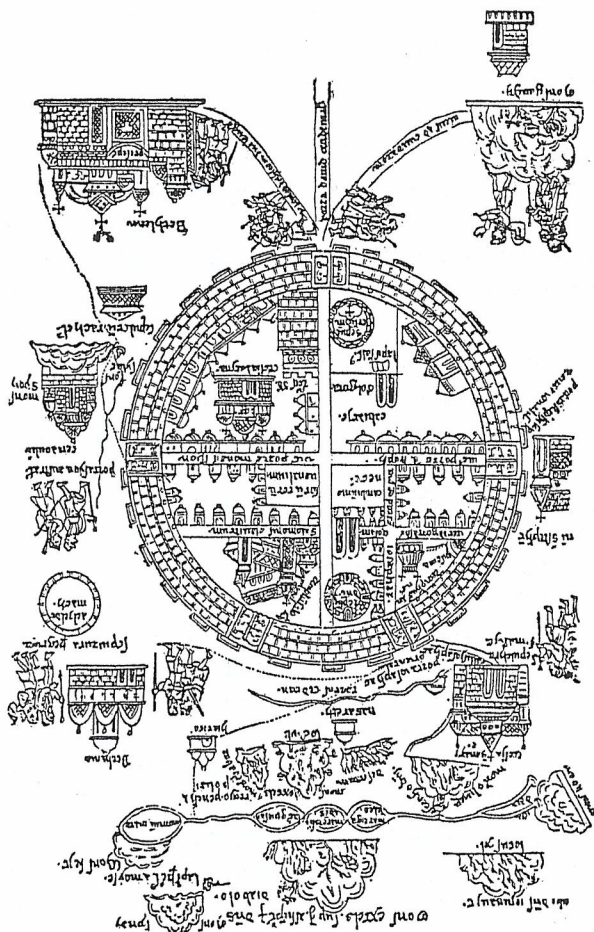


Fig. 3-1: Twelfth-century map of Jerusalem. North is to the left. Bethlehem is shown in the lower right corner, while Nazareth is indicated by the small domed building near the top, just outside Jerusalem. Inside the city walls, the Temple of the Lord (the Dome of the Rock) is shown as a round shape at the top of the circle, the Temple of Solomon (the Al-Aqsa Mosque) is the complex building in the upper right quarter, and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher is the round shape near the bottom. Pilgrims and other travelers are also depicted. From J.R. MacPherson, ed., *Fetellus* (London: Palestine Pilgrims' Text Society, 1896).
