In 1943 the tide moved against Germany after its massive defeat at Stalingrad. Already forced out of Africa, Germany had to fight in the USSR, in Italy and, from June 1944, in France. To virtually everyone bar Hitler, it was clear that defeat was only a matter of time. Hitler's last hopes failed to materialise. The use of his secret weapons, the V1 and V2 rockets, was stopped by the Allied invasion of Europe, and the USA–USSR alliance failed to break up. Defeat finally came with the Soviet occupation of Berlin in May 1945.


