



ETHNIC DIFFERENCES IN ACHIEVEMENT- Internal Factors

Ethnic Group: people who share a common history, customs and identity, as well as, in most cases, language and religion, and see themselves as a distinct unit.

Evidence of differences
DFES 2007: Whites and Asians on average do better than blacks. However there are significant variations among Asians. e.g. Indians do better than Pakistani's and Bagladeshis. See the graphs in your booklets.

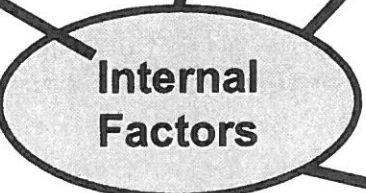

5. Selection and segregation.

Gilborn (1997) argues that marketisation has given schools a greater chance to select and this has put some ethnic minorities at a disadvantage.
