SHAYMA and KAYLEIGH occupy different areas of the stage. Both hold recording apparatus and are trying to conduct interviews. KAYLEIGH is in a town centre, SHAYMA is outside the offices of McArthur Gledhill in Kent. Various members of the COMPANY pass them as they try to grab a word. They overlap.

SHAYMA. Hello. Hi.
