Secularization - less religious importance attached to marriage.

Privatization of family life - less pressure from extended family (kin) to stay married.

Higher demand for what is included in a marriage.

Wider availability of effective contraception.

2013) Same Sex Marriage:

Resulting in couples in a heterosexual relationship, now to feel they can potentially get into a homosexual marriage leading onto marriage (so divorce their heterosexual partner now they can finally have a same sex marriage).

Divorce Reforms Act:

- Increased life expectancy, so couples have more time for their relationship to fall apart.

↳ Family Law Act:

- Reduced the length of time that a couple needed to be married, from 3 → 1 year.

- Divorces became easier and cheaper, enabling legal termination of already unhappy marriages.

↳ Divorce Reform Act:

- You could use irreversible breakdown, for the grounds for divorce.

Equality Act:

- Brought together key anti-discrimination policies, to protect people against discrimination in the workplace.

- On the other hand, they increase the ratio due to they are younger, many immigrants have more children.

- The longer a group is settled in the country, the closer their fertility rate comes to the national average.

Dependency Ratio:

- Immigrants lower dependency ratio, as they are more likely to be of working age. Also, many return to country of origin to retire.

Population Size:

- Leads to a natural increase, with birth exceeding deaths
- Births to non-UK born mothers are higher and account for about 25% of all births.

Migration Issues:

Globalisation:

More diversity as migrants now come from a much wider range of countries, therefore there is a wider mix of people and cultures in the UK.

Feminisation of migration:

Today almost $\frac{1}{2}$ of all global migrants are female. This is a result of the expansion of occupations seen as typically female → leading to a demand in female labour.

Impact of Migration on types of families and the UK population structure.

Indirectly

- More babies are produced, as immigrant are generally younger and therefore more fertile.

Age Structure:

- Immigration lowers the average age of the population, both directly and indirectly
 - Directly - Generally immigrants are younger
 - In 2011, the average age of UK passport holders was 41 whereas non-UK passport holders av. age 31.
